From the desk of our Pastor, Father Ernest

'SEE YOU AT THE EUCHARIST!'

This is the expression which I used in my very first message to you my dear parishioners of Saint Sebastian's. I was thinking of the amazing joy of being together, around Jesus. The Mass is a feast; the pascal banquet; it is a celebration our Lord's life and sacrifice. The Eucharist allows us to be in communion with Jesus and with each other, the richness of which we need to discover and enjoy at each Mass. So, I think we should make it a vital point to come to Mass. Once in a while I hear people who say: 'I pray at home, I do not need to go to Church'. Yes, we all need to pray at home but that should not conflict with going to Mass on Sunday.

The first and easy objection to this is that you cannot receive the Eucharist at home, unless you are sick and the priest or the Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist may bring it to you! Anyway, the prayer in the Church with the whole family of believers represents an important aspect of our faith; it does not conflict with private prayer. Some may say that Jesus taught us that we should go in our room and pray privately to our Father who sees what is done in secret! Jesus was teaching this to draw our attention away from showing off about prayer life, the kind of pharisaic attitude which is no good in our spiritual life.

Coming together to Church to pray as God's family consists of being united as one assembly convoked by God for worship (*Qahal Yahweh*), an *Ecclesia*. We gather around the Word of God which is also the Bread of Life and the Bread of the Eucharist. There we celebrate the mystery of our faith, the death and resurrection of our Lord and then we receive his Body and Blood. This is possible only in the Mass, and that is why we need to come to Church. Allow me to share another extract of the Catechism which explains how Jesus is present in the Eucharist:

1373 "Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us," is present in many ways to his Church: in his word, in his Church's prayer, "where two or three are gathered inmyname," in the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, in the sacraments of which he is the author, in the sacrifice of the Mass, and in the person of the minister. But "he is present ... most especially in the Eucharistic species."

1374 The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as "the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend. In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained." "This presence is called 'real' - by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present."

1377 The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ.

So, See you at the Eucharist! Sometimes people are looking for an interesting homily. That is a good reason. But let the homily lead us to connect with Jesus. The main reason to go to Mass should be to meet with Jesus and be nourished with his Word and his Body and Blood. So, see you at the Eucharist and invite somebody, - a friend a relative, a co-worker, a business partner, a neighbor, - to join us in the Church. Jesus promised us that we will be rewarded even if we give a glass of water to someone who is thirsty; imagine if you bring to the Eucharist those hungry souls!
