

From the desk of our Pastor, Father Ernest ADVENT SEASON

My dear brothers and sisters, we are starting another Liturgical Year on this first Sunday of Advent. I feel so excited about it. We're going to pray and sing calling upon the Lord that he may come to us again.

In fact, during the first two weeks of Advent, the accent will be on his coming again in glory as we profess in the Creed, 'He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end'. This aspect makes us remember and consider our final destination when Jesus will manifest his heavenly glory to us in the new world to come.

Closer to Christmas, the accent will be put on the birth of Jesus, how his coming is foretold by the Prophets, announced to Mary and Joseph, until when he is born in Betlehem. So, the reason why I feel excited is that now I know Advent does not start a 'cyclical' like event. It rather means moving forward toward the full revelation of our salvation.

The Messiah we wait for will bring us salvation, peace and joy; he will help us be reconciled. All nations will enjoy his peace, justice and light. Right now, in my mind I am thinking of peace in these countries with devastating wars: Israel and Gaza, Ukraine and Congo, Sudan and horrible sufferings in many other countries that are going through social turmoil such as Nicaragua, Venezuela, Haiti. May the Messiah help us to settle those conflicts and find peace. May his teachings inspire world leaders to seek reconciliation and unity rather than selfish interests.

But we need the Messiah also in the Church, so that we can open more our minds and hearts to his Word. May Jesus come and renew our lives and make us focus more on his ways. We all know this, that as human beings we tend to walk away from him; we tend to look for our joys in places and things that are contrary to his commands. Some time when we look around us, we realize that many go on with their lives as if God does not matter (according to the expression of our Archbishop Wenski). Technology and entertainment mobilize the attention and captivate our dreams of what we can discover, fabricate or as humans. We would like to invent new ways of life, new things; we are restless and only content with our achievements and fail to see the Creator of all things from whom all comes. We need to realize again that the world would be nothing without God and his Son, Jesus the Messiah. But let us be clear: for sure God also likes our scientific and technological achievements; he likes to see that are not apathetic but that we are rather active, using the gifts and talents he gave us in order to find out new possibilities, new horizons. We just have to realize that new possibilities or new horizons that turn us away from God and the happiness he has promised us are not healthy for us and for the world.

So, Advent is this wonderful Season which reminds us of what matters most: God and his 'Anointed One' whom he sends to save the world. With Jesus, the world finds the way to true happiness which is the way of Love; Love of God and of one another; the way of holiness whereby we are purified of our sinful ways and can live again free of our vices and addictions, of our hatreds and selfishness. Goodness, Justice and Peace can flourish again as Psalm 89 sings. May Jesus come to heal those wounds in our families, to give hope to the youth; may he teach our humanity to care for life, especially for the unborn, and also to preserve the life of our unique planet. May the gifts we give to each other in this season remind us that Jesus is alive and loves us, that he is 'the reason for the Season'.
